Key Vocabulary

Bulbs: grow into new plants.

Flower: the part of the plant that blossoms. Flowers produce the seeds that form new plants.

Evergreen: a tree which keeps its green leaves all year round.

Garden Plants: plants people choose to grow in their garden.

Leaves: use light, air and water to make food for the plant.

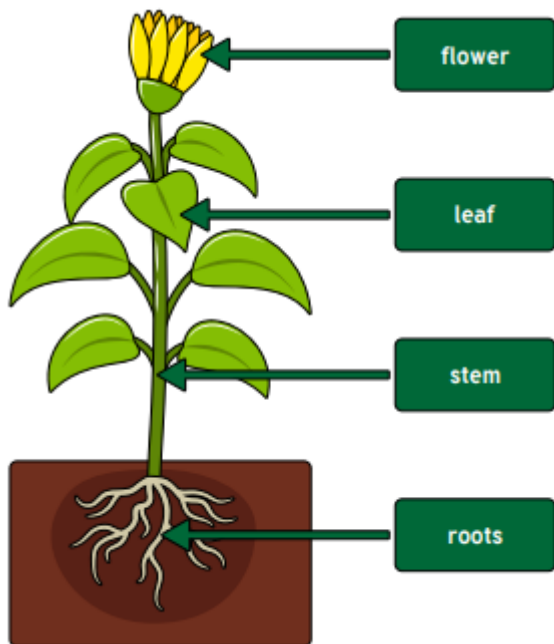
Seeds: grow into new plants.

Stem: holds the plants up and transports water and nutrients to different parts of the plant.

Petal: attracts pollinators (bees) using their bright colours or unusual shapes.

Roots: holds the plant in the ground and absorbs nutrients and water from the soil.

Wild plants: grow where the seeds fall. It does not need to be planted or cared for.
