At the end of YR 6, children take SATS tests. These are national tests which show attainment of our children compared to other 11 year olds.

Level 4 is the expected level

Key Stage Two SATS (Year 6)

We need to be careful when looking at data as the small number of children in the class means that the data is not reliable statistically. They cannot be compared with national figures.

Year 6 a very small cohort (9 pupils) so statistics are not comparable. **One child** was unable to take the **Maths Test**.

The progress of children is also measured and compared to the National Average progress. Expected progress means that a child is in line with the average child from 7 years to 11 years old. Progress may also be classed as '**Better**' than expected if more rapid progress has been made.
