Word	Definition
listen	give one's attention to a sound
fasten	close or do up securely
whistle	- a clear, high-pitched sound made by forcing breath through a small hole between partly closed lips, or between one's teeth - an instrument for producing whistling sounds by means of the breath
castle	a large building, typically of the medieval period, fortified against attack with thick walls, battlements, towers, and often a moat
watch	- look at or observe attentively over a period of time - a small timepiece worn typically on a strap on one's wrist
Christmas	the annual Christian festival celebrating Christ's birth, held on 25 December in the Western Church

Word	Definition
witch	a woman thought to have evil magic powers, popularly depicted as wearing a black cloak and pointed hat, and flying on a broomstick
wrestle	take part in a fight, either as sport or in earnest, that involves grappling with one's opponent and trying to throw or force them to the ground
moisten	to wet slightly
mortgage	a legal agreement by which a bank, building society, etc. lends money at interest in exchange for taking title of the debtor's property, with the condition that the conveyance of title becomes void upon the payment of the debt
glisten	a sparkling light reflected from something wet
scratch	score or mark the surface of (something) with a sharp or pointed object
thistle	a plant of the daisy family, which typically has a prickly stem and leaves and rounded heads of purple flowers
butcher	a person whose trade is cutting up and selling meat in a shop
rustle	make a soft, muffled crackling sound like that caused by the movement of dry leaves or paper
christen	to give (a baby) a Christian name at baptism as a sign of admission to a Christian church.

glistening	shine with a sparkling light
hustled	to be pushed roughly
soften	to make or become soft or softer
nestled	settle or lie comfortably within or against something
listener	a person who listens, especially someone who does so in an attentive manner
bustling	move in an energetic and busy manner
fastened	to be closed up securely
gristle	cartilage, especially when found as tough inedible tissue in meat
jostle	push, elbow, or bump against (someone) roughly, typically in a crowd
wrestling	the sport or activity of grappling with an opponent and trying to throw or hold them down on the ground, typically according to a code of rules
catching	- infectious - to seize or capture, especially after pursuit
apostle	each of the twelve chief disciples of Jesus Christ
watched	to have looked at or observed attentively over a period of time
