

Key Vocabulary

Amphibians: live in water as babies and on land as the grow older. They have smooth slimy skin.

Birds: all have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.

Fish: live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin and fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.

Mammals: animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.

Reptiles: all breathe air and have scales in their skin.

Carnivore: animals that mostly eat other animals.

Herbivore: animals that only eat plants.

Omnivore: animals that eat both plants and other animals.

Sight: eyes let you see all around you.

Hearing: ears let you listen to all the things around you.

Touch: skin gives you a sense of touch.

Taste: your tongue lets you taste.

Smell: you smell using your nose.
