## What things does a plant need to grow?

In order for a seed to survive and grow into a strong plant it needs water, light, suitable temperature, air and time.

## Key vocabulary

<u>Roots</u> Hold the plant in the ground and absorb water and nutrients from the soil

<u>Stem</u> Transports water and nutrients to different parts of the plant.

<u>Leaves</u> Use light, air and water to make food for the plant.

<u>Flower</u> The part of a plant that blossoms. Flowers produce the seeds that form new plants.

<u>Petal</u> Attract pollinators (bees) using their bright colours or unusual shapes.

<u>Trunk</u> The stem of a tree, from which its branches grow.

<u>Seeds</u> The part of a plant from which a new plant grows.

<u>Deciduous</u> a tree which looses its leaves each year.

<u>Evergreen</u> a tree which keeps its green leaves all year round even in the winter.
