Keeping School Open for all

Please support us in keeping school open for everyone

- Minimizing the number of adults attending the site– only one parent or carer at drop off and collection
- Adults to wear masks on site
- Stick to the correct timings for drop off and collection so that your child doesn't come into contact with any other staff or children not in their bubble. If you don't it increases the chances that your child may have to self isolate.
- No excess bags or resources to be brought into school so that we can keep areas clear and easier to clear throughout the day.

All of these measures will limit the mixing of children and adults and so reduce the risk of further closures.
