

# **Christ Church C of E Primary School Sport Premium Funding 2019-2020**



## What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is continuing to provide funding of £150 million per annum for the academic year 2019/2020. This funding will be directly allocated to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. OFSTED will play a significant role in ensuring that schools target this funding in areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children throughout the Primary Phase.

At Christ Church this will be calculated at £21,640.66 for 2019/2020 (Carried forward £9,790 from previous year) Total of £31,433

#### What is the Purpose of the Funding?

Schools will have to spend the funding on improving their provision of PE and school sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### So what does Christ Church have planned for the remaining sports funding for 2019/2020?

- > Continue to invest and develop outdoor play areas to encourage active breaks/lunchtimes- More playground markings/introduction of OPAL Outdoor play and learning.
- ➤ Use funding to help support PE curriculum post COVID 19. With restrictions on team/invasion games more basic equipment may be needed for sufficient use for all bubbles sharing equipment.
- > Invest in competition kits with school Logo for school games competitions.
- Continue to support the new Change4Life sport club. This will target those children who are the least active in the school.
- Encouraging Health Awareness including; Inviting professionals to deliver assemblies/workshops to educate pupils/staff and parents, Achieving healthy schools award.
- Invest in PE curriculum enrichment days to provide the children with opportunities outside the usual scope of our school's provision e.g to cover minibus/transport costs for trips to Airbounce Trampolining, GoApe, Silksworth Ski slope Sunderland.

## The impact of this funding will be measured through:

- Pupil perception questionnaires measuring the interest of children in different areas of the PE curriculum
- Direct feedback by teachers on the quality of support offered by the specialist
- Feedback from the specialist teachers to the Head Teacher on the level of engagement by teachers
- The increase in the number of children engaging in inter school sporting activities
- The number of children attending a sports club either in school or outside
