- English We will be reading my most favourite book "Holes" by Louis Sachar and will use this book as a stimulus for our writing. We will be writing non-chronological reports and discussion texts surrounding themes in the book. We will also be reading "Can you see me?" by Libby Scott, a story written by an 11 year old girl with autism.
- **Maths** We will be revising key components of the curriculum to ensure we are ready for year 7. We will focus on fractions, percentages and algebra as well as lots of opportunities for problem solving.
- Science Our units this term are Evolution and Inheritance and Electricity. We will also be partaking in our SRE sessions regarding growing up.
- **RE** We will be following the Understanding Christianity units **How can following God bring freedom** and justice? and **Creation v Science: Conflicting or complementary**?
- **History** We will continue our unit of work exploring the Ancient Maya. We will also be exploring the history of our local area.
- **Geography** we will using lots of maps of the local area and learning about Ordnance Survey and compass directions.
- **Art** We will be learning about lots of printing techniques and making prints of our own. We will also be learning to sew and embellish our own designs.
- **Design Technology** We will be using tools to cut and sand our own designs in woodwork. We will also be making our own electrical components.
- ICT Using Scratch to desig, write and debug programs; using excel to present information
