Key Dates

1225: First evidence of the Fish Quay.
1668: Christ Church built.
17th Century: Jingling Geordie, pirate and smuggler used a cave as a lookout.
24th November 1864: Steamship Stanley hit the Black Middens.

Key Vocabulary

Aerial view: look at something from above.
Black Middens: a reef at the mouth of the River Tyne.
Compass: a device that can show direction. The main points are north, south, east and west.
Map: drawing of part of the earth's surface.
North Shields: a town on the north bank of the River Tyne in North Tyneside.
Shipwreck: the destruction of a ship by sinking or breaking up.
The Fish Quay: located at the mouth of the River Tyne. The original settlement of North Shields.
