confident	feeling or showing confidence in oneself or one's abilities or qualities

transparent	- allowing light to pass through so that objects behind can be distinctly seen - easy to perceive or detect

convenient	fitting in well with a person's needs, activities, and plans involving little trouble or effort
experiment	a scientific procedure undertaken to make a discovery, test a hypothesis, or demonstrate a known fact
intelligent	having or showing the ability to acquire knowledge and skills to a high level
adjacent	next to or adjoining something else
nourishment	the food necessary for growth, health, and good condition
