


Key Vocabulary

Canine Teeth: Designed to tear and rip food.

Carnivore: An animal that eats other animals.

Digest: Breaking down food so it can be used by the body.

Herbivore: An animal that eats plants.

Incisor Teeth: Designed to bite and cut food.

Molar Teeth: Designed to grind food

Oesophagus: A tube which moves food from the mouth to the stomach.

Omnivore: An animal that eats plants and animals.

Premolar Teeth: Designed to hold and crush food.

Stomach: An organ where food is broken down with stomach acid and by being churned around.

Small Intestine: Part of the intestine where nutrients are absorbed into the body.

Large Intestine: Part of the intestine where water is absorbed from remaining waste food.

Predator: An animal that hunts and eats other animals.

Prey: An animal that gets hunted and eaten by other animals.

Producer: A plant that produces its own food.

Rectum: Stools (poo) are stored before leaving the body through the anus.

Wisdom Teeth: Some people have them, but they have no function now.
