
#### Playtimes

As you saw staff and volunteers worked really hard during lockdown to improve the resources that the children have to use during playtimes. I thought that I could take this opportunity to provide you with further information about how playtimes work and share some of our future plans.

We are really lucky to have such a lovely outside space, which includes the trees and climbing equipment, that that the children can enjoy. The playground, its equipment and the trees are all risk assessed annually to ensure their safety. We do have items that are getting older and that received damage during the recent storms, although these have been inspected and are safe to use, we do have a plan in place to ensure that any minor maintenance and aesthetic work is to be carried out during the holidays when the weather is better.

All monies raised by the Friends of Christ Church through their hard work at valentines day will go to the improvement of the playground.

When the playground equipment was put in, each age group was given their own area with age appropriate equipment in it. At home times and before school we often have children playing on equipment that are not within the appropriate age range. The castle in the Key Stage 2 yard is designed for children in year 4-6, and the pirate ship and trim trail are designed for children in year 1-3. Can we please ask that after collecting your child at home time you do not stay and play on the equipment.
